The Pandit Neki Ram Sharma Government College, Rohtak is affiliated to Maharishi Dayanand University, Rohtak. The New Education Policy's (NEP 2020) standards will be addressed considering new courses at the college. In the upcoming semester, our university will likely decide to benefit from NEP 2020. In accordance with the policies and procedures of the university, it will provide multidisciplinary courses. The same regulations will be applicable to the college. Currently, the institution provides courses in computer science, commerce, arts, and sciences. Few classes introduce these two subjects during Odd semester whereas classes with professional courses offer the subjets during Even semester. Our college has highly competent faculty that can be involved in multidisciplinary course requirements, in line with the New Education Policy (NEP 2020).

Further, the college also hones the skills of students in Computer Applications through a Course on Compulsory Computer Education which is offered to all the students of T.D.C. I Year. The College is also providing value-based education through seminars and activities conducted by NCC, NSS, and NGOs. Our institute is also interested in introducing new skill development programmes in the coming years as per the current demand in society.

Since administrative oversight transitioned to Pandit Neki Ram Sharma Government College in 2006, there has been a significant rise in female enrollment, increasing from 13.6% in 2006 to nearly 45% by the 2023-24academic year. The women's cell organizes workshops, lectures, and training sessions

aimed at improving the mental and physical well-being of female students. To ensure safety, the campus is equipped with CCTV surveillance, and the Discipline Committee actively monitors adherence to regulations. Access to campus facilities is controlled, with visitor logs maintained at the girls' hostel. The Internal Complaints Committee efficiently addresses concerns brought forward by female students. A variety of awareness programs and educational outings enhance the overall student experience. Female students have access to dedicated common areas, reading spaces, lawns, and sections of the cafeteria. Additionally, mentorship sessions are available throughout the academic year to support students in academic, professional, and personal matters.

Both students and staff are encouraged to use these facilities for proper waste disposal and to adopt practices like reusing single-sided paper.

Dead leaves and plant debris are collected for composting, while old items are sorted for recycling. The NSS unit leads cleanliness

drives, which have contributed to the college being designated as a "No Plastic Zone." Liquid waste is efficiently managed through proper drainage systems to prevent stagnation.

In its pursuit of carbon neutrality, the college has chosen LPG gas burners over traditional fuel sources. It actively manages laboratory waste and runs a "wealth from waste" program. E-waste is disposed of responsibly, with unserviceable items sold to scrap merchants and inkjet cartridges refilled for reuse. Additionally, waste materials are creatively repurposed for decorations during college events, showcasing the institution's commitment to effective waste management practices.

Since administrative oversight transitioned to Pandit Neki Ram Sharma Government College in 2006, there has been a significant rise in female enrollment, increasing from 13.6% in 2006 to nearly 45% by the 2023-24academic year. The women's cell organizes workshops, lectures, and training sessions aimed at improving the mental and physical well-being of female students. To ensure safety, the campus is equipped with CCTV surveillance, and the Discipline Committee actively monitors adherence to regulations. Access to campus facilities is controlled, with visitor logs maintained at the girls' hostel. The Internal Complaints Committee efficiently addresses concerns brought forward by female students. A variety of awareness programs and educational outings enhance the overall student experience. Female students have access to dedicated common areas, reading spaces, lawns, and sections of the cafeteria. Additionally, mentorship sessions are available throughout the academic year to support students in academic, professional, and personal matters.

The college's women's cell plays a crucial role in enhancing the well-being of female students by organizing workshops, extension lectures, and training programs that focus on their mental and physical health. Safety and Security: To safeguard students, the campus is equipped with a

network of strategically placed Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) cameras. Discipline Committee: The Discipline Committee is tasked with enforcing campus regulations and ensuring student safety through comprehensive supervision of academic and campus activities. Restricted Entry: Security personnel conduct thorough checks at all entry and exit points, and the girls' hostel maintains detailed visitor logs, recording names and contact information of all visitors. Internal Complaints Committee: The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) provides a platform for female students to raise concerns, ensuring that these issues are addressed promptly. The college also organizes various awareness programs and educational excursions to support the holistic development of all students. Common Rooms: Dedicated common rooms, separate reading areas in the library, distinct lawn spaces, and segregated canteen facilities are exclusively available for female students. Counseling: Mentorship programs offer students valuable quidance through regular discussions focused on academic performance, professional goals, and personal matters, providing support throughout the academic year.

The NSS unit leads cleanliness drives, which have contributed to the college being designated as a "No Plastic Zone." In its pursuit of carbon neutrality, the college has chosen LPG gas burners over traditional fuel sources. It actively manages laboratory waste and runs a "wealth from waste" program. E-waste is disposed of responsibly, with unserviceable items sold to scrap merchants and inkjet cartridges refilled for reuse. Additionally, waste materials are creatively repurposed for decorations during college events, showcasing the institution's commitment to effective waste management practices.
